

COUNCIL NOTES June 11, 2024

It was a pleasure to welcome to our June meeting the three new Council members recently elected to serve a three-year term: Paul Feaser II, Sarah Kebert, and Ralph Reisinger. We're grateful for their faith, enthusiasm and willingness to serve and ask that you keep them, and all members of Council, in your prayers so that together with all of you, we can deepen our faith and sense of community with God as our guide.

Devotions focused on change, with the reminder that change doesn't happen accidentally, it requires choices. God waits on all of us to say, "Yes Lord, I am ready to make changes." We have to let go of our old ways, and this is certainly applicable to our journey to find our new call Pastor. We need to trust and support the Call Committee, and most importantly, to trust God's timing. As an update, the Call Committee has entered our Ministry Site Profile form on the ELCA site, and the committee and Pastor Mitch Phillips from the Synod recently met to discuss the next steps which include talking about strategies for interviewing.

Sincere thanks to the members of HTLC who continue to share their gifts and resources in so many selfless ways. Our various areas of ministry reported that the 2024 Hunger Walk had over 200 participants, six dogs, ten churches/mosques and \$10,618 raised. The Garage Sale team's incredible hard work resulted in an income to date of \$4,254, with a bit more still to come! Great support continues to be given to our Focus Giving which is Habitat for Humanity in June and Vacation Bible School in July, as well as consistent generosity for the Food Box. (A reminder that kids don't get breakfast or lunch at school during the summer months, so it's more important than ever that we keep our Food Box stocked.)

And speaking of youth, encourage your family, friends and neighbors to attend Vacation Bible School (VBS) which begins on Monday, July 22. The Christian Education and Youth team is making plans to take VBS youth helpers to lunch during that week to try to connect with them in the hopes they will get more engaged with the church, and Pastor Barbara will put a call out for 7th and 8th graders for confirmation classes that would begin in the Fall.

Please mark your calendars now: In order to accommodate the massive amount of time it takes to set up for VBS in the Family Life Center, on **SUNDAY**, **JULY 21**, there will be **ONLY ONE SERVICE**, **IN THE SANCTUARY**, **AT 9 AM**. Let's fill the sanctuary to over-flowing as we praise God!

Change in our lives is inevitable, but we are blessed that... "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8)

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

But thanks be to God, who in Christ always leads us in triumphal procession, and through us spreads in every place all the fragrance that comes from knowing him. For we are the aroma of Christ..." (2 Corinthians 2:14-15a)

As we enjoy summer, much in the garden is ripening for harvesting. Though the springtime aroma of lilacs has faded away, harvesting herbs bring their own aroma – basil, rosemary, tarragon, thyme, marjoram, sage and dill. Whenever I strip the herbs after drying them, their fragrance lingers on my fingers long afterwards even after washing my hands.

Paul tells us that Christ leads us triumphantly through our days and in us spreads the fragrance of knowing him. We are the aroma of Christ in our community and in the world.

How are we spreading the aroma of Christ wherever we are, wherever the day takes us, with whomever we meet?

Smell is perhaps the most powerful sense. Certain smells bring us back to our grandma's fresh baked peach cobbler, apple picking with our children, the vacation on the ocean beach with our family, working on car repairs with your Dad and the scent of oil and gas, the freshly mown grass of your childhood home, the hot-of-the press ditto sheets from our school years, the perfume your mom always wore, and oh, so many others that transport us back in time or fill us at the present moment. I have so enjoyed the smell of our freshly mown meadow every summer when they cut, dry and then bale the hay.

Of all the wonderful fragrances we smell and enjoy, do we breathe in deeply the aroma of Christ our Lord so that it fills us, lingers in us?

Do we spread the aroma of kindness, compassion, forgiveness, grace, peace, hope, love, joy, mercy and justice? Can others smell the fragrance of Christ in us that we leave with them? Does the fragrance of Christ linger long after our contact with others?

Think about what fragrance of Christ you offer to others and in what ways you leave that fragrance with them. Do they notice your graciousness, kindness, sense of peace, hope, love you leave them with? Do they smell the difference in you, because of Christ Jesus – that you won't abide certain jokes or comments that belittle people of another color, gender, or ethnicity? That you are willing to defend and speak up for the vulnerable, those who face discrimination or injustice of any kind?

Do we fill our congregation with the aroma of Christ that lingers with us long after Sunday worship ends and carry that aroma out into our community?





We will be blessing backpacks, teacher bags, laptop bags, etc. as our children head back to school and summer draws to a close. Kids can bring in their backpacks for the blessing as well as high school, college, teachers and others bring in their bags or laptop bags.

GOD'S WORK. OUR HANDS. is the ELCA mission project Sunday. This year it will be on September 8.

We are planning to take part this year with a simple mission project; to provide personal care kits for Lutheran World Relief. These kits are distributed in refugee camps where there has been war, natural disasters, famine, etc.

The personal care kits consist of: 1 darker colored bath towel, 1 metal nail clipper, 1 toothbrush, 1 large comb and 2 bars of soap. Many of the items can be found at dollar stores and some folks buy 2 or more kits worth of items.

Everyone at Holy Trinity of all ages and abilities can take part. Pick up a kit's worth of items (or more) and bring them in during the summer. There will be a collection box.

On Sunday, September 8 we will have one service at 9 am and then gather in the FLC to assemble the kits and box them. The boxes of personal care kits will go to Jerusalem Lutheran Church in October along with the quilts Sassy Scissors have made on their collection weekend. We will enjoy an ice cream social afterward and fellowship.

We hope that you will plan to participate and collect the items needed over these summer weeks. Our Hands will be doing God's Work in the world providing comfort and relief to those most in need.


