FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



In Luke 9:28-36 we read the account of the transfiguration of Jesus, how on that mountaintop with his disciples, Peter, James and John, Jesus shone with the glory of God and his appearance changed and radiated the glory that was in him and was him as the Son of God.

Understandably, in the presence of the glory of heaven the disciples wanted to preserve that fleeting yet impactful moment. And after hearing God's voice declaring Jesus as God's Son, God's Chosen and the hearing the command, "Listen to him!" and seeing Jesus again in the familiar way he was, they kept silent and kept what they had seen and experienced within themselves, probably because no one would've believed them.

Not only was Jesus' appearance changed that day in that moment, but it symbolized the change that Jesus came to make known and embodied. In him, all things change – broken lives are made whole through forgiveness, the lame walk, the blind see, the deaf hear, and what is dead is given new life.

The lives of the disciples were forever changed when they encountered Jesus. The lives of so many were changed by their encounter with Jesus. Our lives are changed when we encounter Jesus. Oh, there were a few who met Jesus and couldn't embrace the new life he offered to them. One had to go home to his family, another had to bury his father, and yet another couldn't give up his wealth. They clung to the old, the familiar, to that which they thought gave them security but in the end, would only fade away, rot, rust, be stolen or die. They gave up on the fullness of life in Christ and the riches of the blessings living in him brings.

How often we cling to the old and familiar, unsure of the new and its uncertainty. How we resist change even though it leads to new life, to a fullness and richness. We tend to stick with the tried and true. Yet, Jesus, invites us into a newness of life, into change that brings goodness.

I am reminded of this as Holy Trinity Lutheran Church prepares to call a new pastor.

Jesus never called all who followed him into a comfortable or familiar life. Yes, there is comfort in Christ and his love, but as his disciples, we are often called out of our comfort zones to serve him in the world and in our community. He reaches out his hand to us and invites us to step forth in faith not certainty, to share and use the gifts we've been given even when we're unsure of our gifts, to trust him that he will be with us, to lean on his strength, and to enter into the new life he offers. In order to grow, in order to live the fullness of our faith, we need to embrace change. The things we so long for in our lives and in our life together as a community of faith mean that there will be change. Change is a constant in life and the changes Christ our Lord makes are for our well-being, for goodness, for abundant life and joy.

So, as we await the calling of a new pastor, may we trust that though there may be change, we can embrace its newness, and freshness. May we trust that though there will be change, we can step into serving in new ways and ministering afresh with one another and in the community of Canton.

May the glory which shone forth from Jesus on that mountaintop, also shine forth from us, and when the time comes, in your relationship with your new pastor. May we be examples of embracing change and the newness of life that it brings. May we trust our Lord who leads us ever into goodness and abundant life through the changes HE brings.
