"He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, 'See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over to the Gentiles; they will mock him, and spit upon him, and flog him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise again." (Mark 10:32-34)

In this season of Lent, we make the journey to Jerusalem with Jesus and the disciples, knowing all too well, what awaits Jesus; death on the cross. It is an unsure journey we make. Most of us would rather focus on Easter and the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. But the only way to that celebration is the hard road to Jerusalem and the cross. Indeed, if we are courageous enough and take that walk with Jesus and the disciples we will be led through betrayal, denial, fear, suffering and being confronted with a death undeserving, yet willingly gone through out of a profound love for us and all humanity.

When we sit with the challenge of all Jesus went through and suffered for us, we are transformed and touched deeply to the very core of our being. We ponder the times we've been betrayed, denied, full of fear, suffered, and died to some degree – losing a beloved one, losing a job, facing a move, battling an illness, giving up and over our youthfulness as our bodies age and energies wane. It is hard to spend time reflecting on these things, but the only way is through, just as it was for Jesus.

We are distressed by the happenings in our world, the mass shootings especially, in schools, wars, natural disasters like tornadoes, hurricanes with destructive rains washing away homes in North Carolina and the devasting wildfires in California leaving whole communities in utter destruction. And we wonder, in the face of such things, where is God?

I would venture to say, suffering in the very midst of us. God, on Good Friday, suffered the very death of God's own Son, given up, out of love for each and every one of us. He knows our deep grief, anguish, and yet offers hope, new life, eternal life, and grace in the resurrection of Christ.

Frederick Buechner, the late Presbyterian pastor and author, notes, that the grace of God of says to us, "Here is the world. Beautiful and terrible things will happen. Don't be afraid. I am with you."

The cross is God saying to us, "Don't be afraid. I am with you. I love you so very much and deeply that I came to be with you, suffered alongside of you, and give to you new life, and eternal life. I promise you this. Trust me. Love me. I did this all for you."

So as this interim time comes to an end and you move through Lent this year, you do so with the hope of a new pastor and a new life before you as a congregation, even as we do each Lent with the hope of the resurrection in our hearts, knowing how it all turns out so wonderful and amazing in the end.

As we make our way to Jerusalem and the cross this Lenten month, may we know that God walks with us, is loving us and ever-leading us into new life. May we trust God in all things and know a love so deep and real that makes us worthy to die for. The only way to the celebration of Easter and the resurrection is through the betrayal, denial, mocking, suffering and death. Don't be afraid. Don't be afraid of the newness of life that awaits you.

Yes, it is uncertain, and unknown, but don't be afraid. God is with us every single step of the way. Pastor Barbara



HOW TO OBSERVE AND LIVE THE FORTY DAYS OF LENT

Begin the season by joining us for worship on **Ash Wednesday, March 5** at **11am or 7pm** where there will be the Imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

Lent Madness is back. The bracket is posted on the bulletin board and you can visit lentmadness.org or their Facebook page, every day and read about the lives of the two saints for that day and then vote for the one you want to move ahead. It's a wonderful way to learn more about these faithful and sometimes quirky people and be inspired and encouraged by their example of faith.

A new **Lenten Giving Calendar** will be given out on Sunday, March 2. Receive a little house (one per household) to collect your daily giving during Lent. This year our extra and sacrificial offerings will go to Lutheran Disaster Response. We will split our offerings for both Hurricane relief, those affected in North Carolina, and for Wildfire relief, those affected in California. So many have lost their homes, possessions and businesses, that the little house is a reminder of helping to rebuild and recover homes and communities as well as the blessing of the homes we have.

Lenten Study this year will be shorter and we will use the movie, *"Babette's Feast"* to explore the many themes so appropriate for Lent. The study will begin Wednesday, March 12 at 6pm and Thursday, March 13 at 10am. Since choir members often come on Wednesday evenings, we will try for a three week study. Thursday mornings will be two week studies but will go over an hour.

"Guided to the Cross" devotional booklets have been sent out to all. Use them daily in your time with God.

Worship with us each week as live these forty days of Lent and follow Jesus to the cross.

Give of your time to help with any or all our mission projects during Lent and serve others even as Christ served us.

Worship with us during Holy Week: Palm Sunday, April 13, Maundy Thursday, April 17, and Good Friday, April 18. Worship times will be announced later.

Easter Sunday will be celebrated on April 20.
