FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



"Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." (Luke 24:5)

These words, spoken by the angels that greeted the women who discovered that the tomb where Jesus' body was laid was empty on that first Easter morning, tell the good news we celebrate Easter Sunday! We can take heart, be of good courage, have hope and be filled with joy! This is what the gospel is all about – the good news of Jesus Christ our Lord. Jesus is alive, lives again and is on the loose in the world and in the lives of people! What a wonder to celebrate! What joy is ours!

The late Rachel Held Evans in her book, *Inspired*, notes that when many Christians talk about the gospel, "they often say, 'Jesus came to die,' referring to a view of Christianity that reduces the gospel to a transaction, whereby God needed a spotless sacrifice to atone for the world's sins and thus sacrificed Jesus on the cross so believers could go to heaven. ...Dallas Willard called it, 'the gospel of sin management.'

"Jesus didn't just 'come to die'. Jesus came to live – to teach, to heal, to tell stories, to turn over tables, to touch people who weren't supposed to be touched and eat with people who weren't supposed to be eaten with, to break bread, to pour wine, to wash feet, to face temptation, to tick off the authorities, to fulfill Scripture, to forgive, to announce the start of a brandnew kingdom, to show us what that kingdom is like, to show us what God is like, to love his enemies to the point of death at their hands, and to beat death by rising from the grave.

"Jesus did not simply die to save us from our sins; Jesus *lived* to save us from our sins."

We celebrate Easter, knowing Christ Jesus came and lived to save us from our sins, gave his life up for us, so that we would be forgiven and have life; new, abundant and eternal. Who rose from death to life that we would have joy and hope.

The biblical scholar, N.T. Wright defines hope as, "what you get when you suddenly realize that a different worldview is possible, a worldview in which the rich, the powerful, and the unscrupulous do not after all have the last word. The same worldview shift that is demanded by the resurrection of Jesus is the shift that will enable us to change the world." For death is not the end, new and eternal life is now possible because of the resurrection of Jesus. Our worldview changes of what is possible and gives us hope to live with all of our days.

So, let us celebrate with joy and thanksgiving that Jesus lived and lives again and anew! Let us celebrate with joy, that by the death and resurrection of Christ Jesus we are forgiven and given new life and eternal life. Let us celebrate with joy, the hope we live in and with every day! Let us celebrate with joy that the gospel, the good news of Jesus is for all the world and infuses the world with life, hope, forgiveness, peace and abounding joy! Let us celebrate with joy that your new pastor, Juli, will bring new possibilities, new ministries and fresh ideas to Holy Trinity. What a wonderful way to celebrate the good news of Easter than with your new pastor arriving and living into new life with you!

Blessings and joy to you this Easter! Alleluia! Christ is Risen! Jesus came to live and live again and anew that we would have life!
